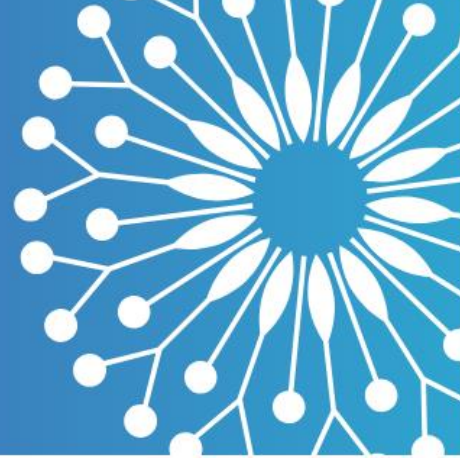


INVITATION TO PARTICIPATE IN A PATIENT AND RELATIVES ADVISORY BOARD (PRAB)



HELP US SHAPE THE FUTURE OF CARE FOR YOUNG CANCER SURVIVORS

Surviving cancer as a teenager or young adult is a major victory, but we know that many long-term challenges remain. PredictAYA is a research project dedicated to understanding the impact of these late effects from cancer treatment and finding ways to prevent them.

Who are we?

Project name: Prediction and prevention of late effects in AYA cancer survivors – An effort to understand, predict and prevent late effects in AYAs 15-39 years of age, with a focus on fertility and gonadal toxicity
Project acronym: PredictAYA
Project time: 5 years (1 June 2025 to 31 May 2030)



Using data from health registries, genetic biobanks, and new patient groups, **PredictAYA aims to identify biomarkers that show who is at higher risk for organ damage.** This will help doctors offer **personalized screening and advice**, improving care for survivors. Furthermore, surveys will explore **patients' care preferences and needs**, including fertility, sexuality, mental health, and quality of life.

PredictAYA is a team effort, bringing together clinicians, researchers, psychologists, nurses, but **patients are at the heart of this project.** Your input will shape study design, materials, and outcomes. By working in partnership, the project hopes to create a future where young cancer survivors have the best chances at a healthy, fulfilling future.

Who are we looking for?

Patient representatives – whether experienced as such or completely “new to the job”

- Age at cancer diagnosis was between 15 and 39 years
- Being a relative (e.g. partner, parent)
- Independent of desire for children, being a parent or whether your treatment affected fertility or not
- Interest in shaping research together

A diversity in backgrounds, experiences, educational status, cancer treatment and professions is encouraged. If you have received treatments likely to affect fertility (e.g., radiation therapy), and if you are a young man, you are especially encouraged to participate.

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What would your participation mean?

If you would like to participate, it would mean 2-4 online meetings per year together with the other PRAB members (~10) and researchers from different parts of the project. Meetings may be audio-recorded. You will receive reimbursement for your participation. You can choose your participation according to preference and interest.

Tasks may include:

- Consultation on data and study design
- Audit/review of patient involvement in different parts of the study
- Consultation on outcome measures and surveys, questionnaires, patient information
- Consultation on communication on the use of AI in e.g. prediction modelling
- Dissemination of results/translation of results into lay-language/ making data accessible to patients
- Guideline development, PLAIN language versions, dissemination
- Inclusion in discussions on ethics and data (i.e. data solidarity)
- Including patients in deliverable review processes
- Co-authorship
